Please note that the October dinner/meeting is on a Tuesday again, and will once again be held at the Coronado Yacht Club (vice the golf course). Our Guest of Honor/Speaker will be the USS Coronado Commanding Officer, CDR Michael “Shawn” Johnston (Gold Crew). RSVPs are due NLT Friday, October 11<sup>th</sup>. PLEASE come out and join us for dinner and a GOOD time!!!**

**As we enter the last quarter of this calendar year, we are also once again entering the period where chapter dues need to be renewed for many of our members. With the option we instituted a few years ago of being able to renew your Silver Strand Chapter MOAA membership for either one (\$10 regular/\$5 auxiliary) or multiple years (5 years for \$40 regular/\$20 auxiliary), some members may not be aware of just how long their dues are paid for, and when they need to renew again (vice having to renew every year when renewing for only one year). In order to help with that, at the end of this newsletter you'll find a list of chapter members with the date you are paid through after your name. For example, if a 13 appears after your name, your dues are current and paid through this 2013 year, and you would need to renew for 2014 (or longer). If a 12 appears after your name, we have not received your chapter dues for 2013, and if an 11 appears after your name, we haven't received dues for 2012 or 2013. As always, you can chose the 5 year option by sending us a check for \$40, in which case we'll extend your membership for 5 years. Many members have chosen this option, greatly reducing the frequency of having to deal with renewal - it comes highly recommended! But this year we have an even BETTER option called “Renewal 2020”. For a one-time dues payment of \$50 (\$25 for Auxiliaries), we'll extend membership in the chapter until 2020 for anyone whose dues will expire after the 2013 year, and we'll also include anyone whose dues expired after the 2011 or 2012 years! Membership can be renewed/dues paid if necessary using the dinner**

meeting reservation form on page 5 of this newsletter - we sincerely hope you will ALL continue as members with the chapter as WE NEED YOU!!!

In addition to the above, we are instituting a new category of chapter membership called “Legacy Membership”. This category applies to all chapter members who are either 90 years of age or older, and/or anyone who has been in the chapter for 40 years or more. If you fit into either of these categories the chapter will waive your chapter dues for life. AND, we’ll come up with some sort of jazzy pin or device (TBD) that will identify you as one of our Legacy Members. Now, our records are just a bit sketchy in these areas – we don’t have an accurate, comprehensive list of your birth dates or when you joined the chapter, so we’re on the honor system here – if you claim you qualify, we’ll believe you!!! So see - it pays to hang around as a member of SS MOAA!!!

## LEGISLATIVE NEWS

### Federal Legislation

- **VA Work-Study at State Veterans Homes.** The current legislation authorizing this federal program for veterans working part-time at state Veterans Homes like ours in Chula Vista expired on 6/30/13. Also applies to all state veterans’ cemeteries. An extension of this VA program is in work by both the U.S. House and Senate. In the U.S. House, **HR-1453** was introduced on 4/9/13 to extend this program, and locally Rep Duncan Hunter (R, 50th, El Cajon) and Rep Susan Davis (D, 53rd, San Diego) are the only co-sponsors from our San Diego County delegation. The HVAC now has HR-1453 for action. In the Senate, SVAC Chair Sen Bernie Sanders (I, VT) introduced **S-894** on 5/8/13 to reauthorize this VA Work-Study program. CA Senator Barbara Boxer is supportive of S-894. S-894 and a new House bill, **HR-2151** introduced 5/23/13, want to expand the current VA Work-Study program to allow student vets to work at all congressional offices, and not just at federal VA and state veteran facilities. Rep Juan Vargas (D, 51st, Chula Vista) is one of 3 co-sponsors for HR-2151. All 65 local veterans who are in college and were working part-time at the Chula Vista Veterans Home under this VA program, at \$8/hr became unpaid on 7/1/13. S-894 was included in the Veteran Omnibus Bill **S-944** that passed the SVAC on 7/23/13. The SVAC is to report out on that bill. In the meantime, the program is stopped.
- **HR-32 & S-734.** Rep Joe Wilson introduced the new “Military Surviving Spouses Equity Act,” HR-32 to address the SBP offset to DIC payments. This effort began over 12 years ago, and is called the “widow’s tax.” Rep Susan Davis (D, 53rd, San Diego), Rep Juan Vargas (D, 51st, Chula Vista), Rep Scott Peters (D, 51st, San Diego) and Rep Duncan Hunter (R, 50th, El Cajon) are among the **179 co-sponsors** for this HR-32 legislation. The HASC’s Subcommittee On Military Personnel now has HR-32 for action. This legislation affects over 55,000 military widows, and would finally repeal the requirement for reduction of survivor annuities under the Survivor Benefit Plan to offset the receipt of survivors’ Dependency and Indemnity Compensation. S-734 was introduced as a companion bill to HR-32 on 4/16/13. Sen Barbara Boxer and Sen Feinstein from CA are co-sponsors on S-734. The SVAC has S-734 for action now.
- **H.R. 303.** Same number as last Congress, now called the “**Retired Pay Restoration Act**” and again this new bill for the 113th Congress authorizes the full concurrent receipt of retired military pay and veterans’ disability compensation for retirees regardless of disability rating. Laws have been changed over the years to give concurrent receipt to military retirees with VA disability ratings of over 50%, but not for the majority of veterans with less disability ratings. Rep Gus Bilirakis (R, FL) introduced the new HR-303 on 1/15/13. Only 7 members of the U.S. House from CA are among the **80 co-sponsors** for this bill, and that includes two from our County, Rep Duncan Hunter (R, 50th, El Cajon) and Rep Scott Peters (D, 52nd, San Diego). HR-303 has been assigned to both the HASC’s Subcommittee on Military Personnel, and to the HVAC’s Subcommittee on Disability Assistance & Memorial Affairs.
- **H.R. 333. Disabled Veterans Tax Elimination Act.** This legislation is almost identical to HR-303, as this bipartisan bill would permit retired members of the armed forces with a service-connected disability rating of less than 50% to receive both retirement pay and VA disability compensation, known as “concurrent receipt.” HR-333 has **106 co-sponsors** after being introduced by Rep Sanford Bishop (D, GA 2nd) on 1/22/13. Rep Bishop is the ranking member of the U.S. House Appropriations Subcommittee on Military Construction and Veteran Affairs. Locally, Rep Scott Peters, Rep Duncan Hunter, Rep Susan Davis, and Rep Juan Vargas are among the 106 co-sponsors. The HVAC’s Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs has it.
- **H.R 357. GI Bill Tuition Fairness Act of 2013.** This bipartisan bill would allow veterans using the Post 9/11 GI Bill to pay in-state tuition rates at public colleges and universities even if they don’t meet a state’s residency requirements. Bill has 50 co-sponsors, and Rep Duncan Hunter (R, 50th, El Cajon) and Rep Scott Peters (D, 52nd) are among the 7 from CA.

- **S. 234. Retired Pay Restoration Act of 2013.** This Senate bill is very similar to both H.R. 303 and H.R. 333, addressing the concurrent receipt issue. Sen Harry Reid's S.234 has 20 co-sponsors, including Sen Barbara Boxer from CA. This bill was introduced on 2/7/13.
- **H.R. 1714. Shelter Our Servicemembers Act.** Introduced by Rep Scott Peters (D, 52nd, San Diego) on 4/24/13 establishes a grant pilot program, administered through HUD and the VA, that would provide senior veterans permanent, non-transitional housing. Locally, Rep Susan Davis (D, 53rd) and Rep Juan Vargas (D, 51st) are among the 16 co-sponsors for this bill. The HVAC's Subcommittee on Health has the this for action.
- **Continuing Resolution.** The new 2014 fiscal year begins on 10/1/13, and Congress has yet to approve a continuing resolution, or approved budget, for the new fiscal year. There's a risk of some government agencies shutting down, or reducing to essential services, next Tuesday.
- The VFW's semi-annual Legislative Conference concluded in Washington, DC on 9/20/13. Over 70 members of this VFW national committee from all 50 states met with all 535 members of Congress during this conference. Priority issues for this conference were sequestration, sexual assaults in the military, in-state college tuition rates for all vets, Tricare Prime coverage for military retirees, and trying to get advance appropriation for all VA programs which would be similar to the biennial appropriations now given the VA's healthcare system by Congress. With biennial funding, there's no risk of curtailing VA healthcare, for example, if Congress fails to approve an annual budget or a continuing resolution on time.

### California State Legislation

- **AB-717.** This bill was introduced by ASM Rocky Chavez (R, 76th, Oceanside) on 2/21/13. The bill would change the Governor's 7 member CALVET Board to being an advisory board to the CALVET Secretary and eliminates certain qualifications to be a member of the Board. Board members need only be a member of good standing with a congressionally chartered VSO. The Legislature established the CALVET Board in 1946 and state statutes give the Board broad policy-making authority over CALVET. Over time, the CALVET Board has relinquished its authority, and the California State Commanders Veterans Council had recommended this change. The Assembly approved AB-717 on 5/9/13 with a 75-0 vote. Subsequently, some current members of the CALVET Board and veteran advocates have expressed concern about this bill. As a result, State Senator Ben Hueso (D, 40th, Chula Vista) who chairs the Senate's VA Committee, held a meeting on 8/21/13 in Sacramento to draft amendments to AB-717 to attempt to satisfy all stakeholders. The amended bill says that "The California Veterans Board shall advise the department and secretary on policies for operations of the department. The department shall respond to all proposed policy changes offered by the California Veterans Board prior to the next scheduled meeting of the Board." **AB-717 went to the Governor for his signature or veto on 9/25/13.**
- **AB-639.** This bill takes \$600M of the \$900M in bonds from the CALVET Farm & Home Loan program to fund housing efforts for homeless veterans, specifically multi-family apartments. The \$900M in CALVET bond sales were approved by the voters in 2008. Restructuring the CALVET bonds would require voter approval, probably during the next general election in Nov 2014. This bill passed the Assembly on 5/29/13 with a 77-0 vote. Passed the Senate on 9/10/13, and the Assembly again passed this bill 78-0 on 9/11/13. Next it goes to the Governor for his signature, or veto.
- **AB-614.** ASM Rocky Chavez (R, 76th, Carlsbad) and ASM Toni Atkins (D, 78th, San Diego) originally authored this bill to give homeless veterans priority for admission to California Veterans Homes. The bill was then amended to "investigate" a veteran's financial status prior to being admitted to a state Veterans Home. Later, the bill was amended again to say "review" vice "investigate." The intent of the amended bill is unknown, as a veteran's financial and lodging situations are already part of the state's admission screening process. The amended bill was approved by the Assembly with a 76-0 vote on 4/25/13. Senate's hearing on this bill that was set for 5/14/13 and 6/18/13 were cancelled. There's been no further action on AB-614.
- **AB-13.** ASM Rocky Chavez (R, 76th, Oceanside)(past Acting CALVET/CDVA Secretary) introduced **AB-13** to give non-resident tuition exemption to military veterans. Existing law exempts a student who was a member of the military stationed in CA on active duty for more than 1 year prior to being discharged from paying the higher non-resident tuition at state universities and colleges. AB-13 would eliminate this requirement that a student be stationed in CA to receive that exemption, and would require the student to be discharged immediately prior year in order to receive the exemption. AB-13 passed the Assembly's Committee on Higher Education with a 13-0 vote on 3/20/13. The VA committee passed AB-13 with a 10-0 vote on 4/16/13. This bill passed the Assembly on 5/28/13 with a 77-0 vote. The Senate's Appropriations Committee passed this on 8/30/13 with a 7-0 vote.

**CDR Michael “Shawn” Johnston**  
Commanding Officer, USS Coronado – Gold

A native of North Carolina, Commander Michael (Shawn) Johnston earned a B.S. in Zoology from North Carolina State University and was commissioned an Ensign through the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) program in December 1993.

Commander Johnston is a Surface Warfare Officer whose sea tours include Division Officer tours in USS ARLEIGH BURKE (DDG 51) and USS ENTERPRISE (CVN 65) from October 1994 to November 1998 deploying in support of the conflict in Kosovo and two deployments to the Arabian Gulf. His Department Head tour was as Weapons Officer and Combat Systems Officer in USS LEYTE GULF (CG 55) from October 2001 to October 2004, which included two deployments to the Arabian Gulf and Arabian Sea in support of Operations ENDURING FREEDOM (Afghanistan) and IRAQI FREEDOM. He served as Executive Officer in USS THE SULLIVANS (DDG 68) home ported in Mayport, FL, from June 2007 to June 2009, deploying for seven months in the Mediterranean Sea, Red Sea, Arabian Gulf, Indian Ocean and Sea of Japan.

Commander Johnston earned a Master’s Degree in Operations Research from the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, CA in December 2000 and served in the Navy’s Office of Legislative Affairs (OLA) in Washington D.C. as a Congressional Liaison Officer from November 2004 to January 2007. He began with the Command, Control, Computers, Communications and Intelligence (C4I), Space, and Information Technology (IT) portfolio of programs then transitioned to the Shipbuilding and Surface Warfare portfolio. Commander Johnston served as a planner at the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Joint Force Command Headquarters in Brunssum, The Netherlands, from July 2009 to June 2011. His focus was force generation and planning support to the NATO International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) currently deployed to Afghanistan.

Commander Johnston’s personal awards include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (5 awards), Navy Achievement Medal and various unit, campaign and service medals.

## AUXILIARY LIAISON NEWS

1. Storm the Hill Event. On July 16<sup>th</sup>, almost 100 surviving spouses and other supporters from 20 states met at the Holiday Inn in Alexandria, VA including members of MOAA, MOAA AMAC, MOAA Staff and surviving spouses from various other military organizations met to prepare for the July 17 Storming the Hill Event. The focus of this historic MOAA sponsored event was to educate the 113<sup>th</sup> Congress about the Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) offset and garner co-sponsorship for HR 32 and S.734, which would repeal the offset.

MOAA President VADM Norbert Ryan, Jr. USN (Ret) thanked the attendees and recognized MOAA Staff and AMAC for their efforts to make the event happen. “Successful organizations and successful people never give up”, said Ryan. He assured everyone that MOAA would never give up.

MOAA Government Relations Dept Director Col. Mike Hayden, USAF (Ret), thanked attendees and Deputy Director Col. Phil Odom, USAF (Ret) led a pre-storming briefing, while attendees mingled with their teams. During dinner, teams studied the materials, in their leave behind packets, which featured the Vow of Honor brochure, an SBP-DIC factsheet, and testimonials from five surviving spouses.

On July 17<sup>th</sup>, on one of the hottest days of the year with temperatures approaching 110, the widows and supporters boarded busses and headed to a congressional breakfast at the Rayburn House Office Building. VADM Ryan introduced Rep. Joe Wilson, SC, sponsor of HR-32, who spoke about the injustice of the offset and why it is so important to him to see it repealed. Senator Nelson was unable to attend but sent Rebecca Lange, his military fellow, along with other staff members to represent his office. Traci Voelke and Suzanne Gerstner, surviving military spouses, delivered compelling testimonials on the impact of the offset in their lives and the lives of other surviving spouses. Odom spoke to the education part of the program to the legislative assistants and military legislative assistants in attendance, explaining the offset and the injustice. Then 4 teams tackled the Senate, and 38 teams tackled the House of Representatives, with up to 3 people to a team, to deliver their materials and the message to repeal the SBP/DIC offset and ask for co-sponsorship. I visited 26 Senate offices that day with my team member. We gained some co-sponsors, but need more to sign on. All of our San Diego reps have co-sponsored except Rep. Issa. Senators Feinstein and Boxer have both co-sponsored S.734. With only 26 co-sponsors so far in the Senate versus 58 last year, there is more work to be done.

2. AMAC and MOAA are reviewing the nominees for the Auxiliary Excellence Award. AMAC will be seeking 2 or 3 new members for next year. They are looking for other than CA nominees this year as I will represent our region on the committee for 2 more years.
